Student Vaccination Attestation Requirement

Seattle Colleges have chosen to be a "fully-vaccinated" college system, per Governor Inslee's higher education proclamation. The proclamation requires all students, staff and faculty to be vaccinated for COVID-19 with limited exceptions. By reporting their vaccination status, students join the entire South Seattle College campus community (including faculty and staff who are completing their vaccination reporting in October) in partnership to keep our campus, classrooms, and communities safe and help us avoid the significant disruptions exposure to COVID-19 can cause to the learning experience.

Please note: **All students**, including those taking online classes only, need to report their vaccination status or file for an exemption by (and ideally before) **Nov. 1**. If students do not report their vaccination status or file for an exemption by Nov. 1 they **will not be able to register for Winter Quarter classes** until the process is completed. Since registration for Winter Quarter classes begins on Nov. 1 for current students, it is important to get this done now so they can get the classes they want and have a seamless transition to winter.

The simple reporting process takes place within students' ctcLink account. Vaccinated students will need to have their vaccination type and date or dates administered ready. 


Staff Highlight: An Interview

FAQ - Student Vaccination Attestation/Exemption Requirement

How can I report my vaccination status?

You can report your vaccination status by logging into your ctcLink account

- Login to ctclink at https://gateway.ctclink.us.
- Select your student homepage from the menu in ctcLink.
- Select the Immunization Attestation tile, enter your information, and hit the submit button.

Why am I being asked to report my vaccination status?

In the interest of everyone's health and safety, Seattle Colleges has chosen to be a <u>fully vaccinated campus per Governor Inslee's higher education proclamation</u>. This requires all students, staff, and faculty to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. An individual is considered fully vaccinated <u>two weeks after receiving the final dose of the vaccine</u>. Exemptions to this requirement may be granted for medical or sincerely held religious reasons.

What if I don't report my status?

Students who do not report their status before November 1st, 2021 will be blocked from registering for winter quarter. If your registration is blocked, the hold can be removed after you submit your attestation. New incoming students will also be required to report their status before being able to register for classes.

Will my reported status be checked or verified?

Qualified college staff will only check if you have submitted your attestation for the purposes of applying or removing a hold on your ability to register. At this time your report will not be verified officially, but the Seattle Colleges reserves the right to verify your status in the future.

What if I received a vaccine other than Pfizer, Moderna or Johnson & Johnson?

The drop-down menu in the immunization attestation tile includes a selection for "other COVID-19 Vaccine". Select this option and enter the date or dates you were vaccinated.

Will I have to report my vaccination status each quarter?

No, you will only have to report your status to South Seattle College once.

What if I am in the process of getting vaccinate but not yet fully vaccinated?

Please submit your attestation with the most current information you have.

Can I request an exemption?

Yes, you can request an exemption. When you log into ctcLink to submit your immunization attestation, the drop-down menu includes selections for "exemption – medical" and "exemption – religious." At this time that is all you are required to submit for an exemption.

What if I just don't want to get vaccinated?

As a fully vaccinated campus you will not be allowed to register for classes if you do not report your vaccination status or submit an exemption. Knowingly providing incorrect information on your status may result in disciplinary action.

Do I still have to submit an attestation if I am only taking classes online?

Yes, all students attending South Seattle College, regardless of whether they attend in-person or online are required to attest to their vaccination status to be able to register for winter quarter.

If I do not submit my attestation by Nov. 1st will I be dropped from my fall quarter classes?

At this time there are no plans to remove students from fall quarter classes if they do not attest by Nov. 1st, but you will not be able to register for winter quarter classes.

What else is the college doing to prevent the spread of COVID-19?

Anyone coming to campus must fill out the online <u>daily wellness screening</u>. Everyone on campus is required to wear a <u>mask/face covering</u> regardless of <u>vaccination status</u>. Full details can be found at: https://www.seattlecolleges.edu/coronavirus
